A connector and transcriber between people and their lenses, perspectives, work practices, and professions.</p> |  <h3>Facilitator</h3> <p>A helper that makes something become easier for someone else, and that stimulates discussions, ideation, engagement, learning, shared understanding, and the making of informed decisions and actions.</p> |  <h3>Mediator, Empathiser</h3> <p>An understanding and sensitive person that deals with project difficulties and problems, errors and omissions in work, or a neutral and impartial person that settles differences or decide on disputes. (negotiator, arbitrator, conciliator)</p> |  <h3>Advisor</h3> <p>A trusted suggester of practical, expert, and sound advice. A provider of information, guidance, recommendations, and answers to questions.</p> |
|  <h3>Manager, Leader</h3> <p>A director and controller of coordinated activities in programs, projects, or other endeavours. A person with a high control or influence over follower(s), and can focus their attention and allocation of effort in order to achieve missions and objectives.</p> |  <h3>Overseer</h3> <p>A supervisor that watches over and directs the work of others, as part of quality management, assurance, compliance, and control. (governor)</p> |  <h3>Assistant</h3> <p>An aid and enabler that supplements, complements, and contributes to both work and deliverables</p> |  <h3>Enabler</h3> <p>A helper that provides and manages tools, guidance, methods, frameworks, systems, data repositories, services, and other means to projects and managers.</p> |

A judge of something's merits, worth, quality, or significance.</p> |  <h3>Interpreter, Modeller</h3> <p>An observer that translates observations, signs, measurements, and thoughts into documents, illustrations, or models.</p> |
|  <h3>Methodologist</h3> <p>A designer, analyst, and evaluator of ways of working, work specifications, processes, manageable activities and tasks roles, and deliverables in highly coordinated, distributed, and projects.</p> |  <h3>Information Designer</h3> <p>An explainer, planner, and maintainer of information, data to a particular audience to meet specific objectives as part of knowledge and information management.
